Introduction

Here you should start by introducing the topic and telling the reader what your paper will be discussing. As such, this section should mention the following things:

- The problem/s your research is addressing.
- The scope and rationale of your work.

- The objectives/aims of your research.
- The methodology that you have employed to conduct your research.
- The summary of the entire work.
- The contributions that your paper makes to the area of study.

Literature Review

This section needs to include a critical analysis of the different research work that has been done relevant to your topic. It should further mention the different limitations of those works and in turn, explain how your paper will further add to that research or improve it.

Methods

This section of your paper needs to describe the different methods, techniques, and tools you used to conduct your research. It should feature the relevant statistics, equations and diagrams, and other information in a way that is concise but still enables other researchers to replicate your work.

Experimental Setup

This section should describe how you collected, processed, and organized data from your research.

Results and Discussion

This section consists of the tables, figures, and statistics that show the data that your research has produced. It further needs to explain what exactly that data represents and how it furthers your research.

Conclusions

This section of your outline should tie everything up and provide a summary of the paper.

Acknowledgments

Here you mention the different people and institutions that assisted you in your research.

References

Finally, in this section, you cite all the different sources you used in your research.
